

MINUTES
LOUISBURG TOWN COUNCIL
JANUARY 16, 2018

The Town Council met on Tuesday, January 16, 2018, at 7:30 p.m. at Town Hall. Mayor Karl Pernell and Council Members Bill Williamson, Tom Clancy, Betty Wright, Boyd Sturges, Emma Stewart and Chris Neal were present.

Assistant Administrator Tony King gave the invocation.

Council Member Sturges moved that the minutes be approved. Council Member Clancy seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Council Member Sturges moved to appoint Council Member Tom Clancy as the representative for the Firemen's Relief Fund. Council Member Neal seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Council Member Sturges moved to approve Resolution 2018-1 supporting the use of High Impact Funds for NCDOT Project C-5568 (Bickett Blvd./Johnson Street sidewalks). Council Member Stewart seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Council Member Stewart moved to approve the contract for Building Reuse for Impact Healthcare. Council Member Clancy seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

During public comment, Denise Tucker, 201 Cedar Street, Louisburg, N. C., asked why South Main Street was chosen for sidewalks as opposed to Allen Lane where students are walking to Louisburg High School. Mrs. Tucker inquired about the building that was once Dr. Lee's office, asking if it is now a methadone clinic. Assistant Administrator Tony King explained that a zoning permit was issued for a clinic, which is allowed, and he was not aware that it was a particular type of clinic. Mrs. Tucker asked if anyone had talked to the neighborhood as people were very upset with the clinic being near Louisburg High School. She also inquired about the purchase of the Perry building for \$96,500, asking if the Town knew how much maintenance or rehab it may need.

Jeffrey Tucker, 201 Cedar Street, Louisburg, N. C., inquired about the Town purchasing the Perry building when they don't know what they're going to do with it. Mr. Tucker stated that another sweepstakes has been put in as well as a methadone clinic, and he doesn't think the Council is doing a good job of keeping the citizens happy.

Council Member Sturges moved that the meeting be adjourned. Council Member Williamson seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.
